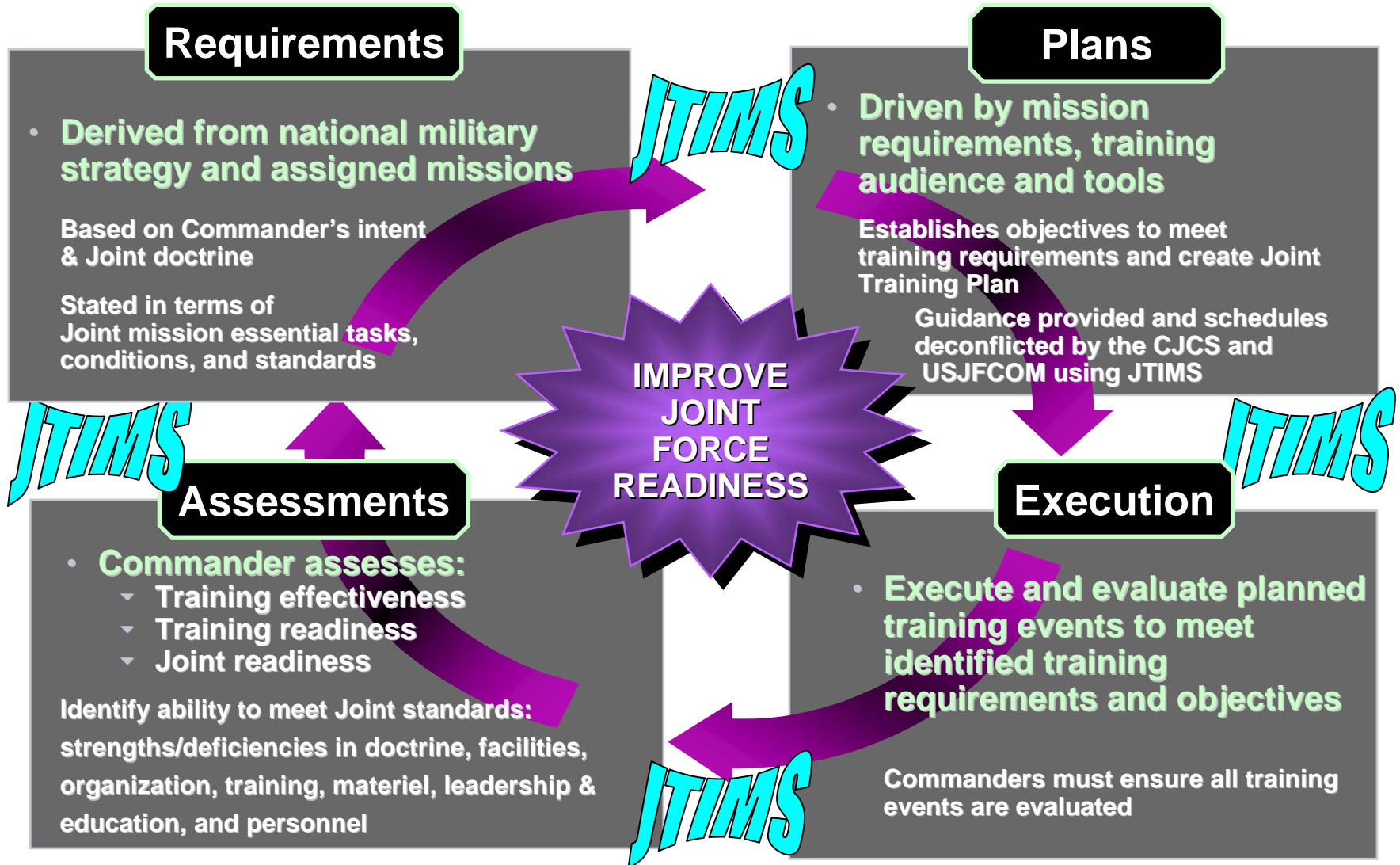


Joint Training System (JTS)

- Integrated, requirements-based method for aligning training programs with assigned missions consistent with command priorities, capabilities, and available resources
- Four-phased, iterative process used in:
 - Requirements
 - Plans
 - Execution
 - Assessment



Four Phases of the Joint Training System





Joint Training Information System (JTIMS)

- A multi-user, Web-based suite of tools that links critical DOD and joint automation programs to support JTS
- Provides automated support:
 - Training tools to joint forces and staffs preparing for joint military operations based on joint training capability requirements
 - For establishing JTS strategic guidance, goals and objectives, and responsibilities; for planning and executing joint training events/milestones
 - Provides a persistent repository for assessment data



JTIMS-DRRS Integration

- Combatant Commander's Joint Mission Essential Task List (JMETL) entered into DRRS via JMETL development tool
- JMETLs exported into JTIMS for use in the JTS and other applications, providing a common needs baseline
- JTS Phase IV Assessment and Block Assessment data exported from JTIMS to DRRS



Benefits of Linkage

- Common requirements start point for operations and training
- Training assessment data to inform DRRS unit training readiness ratings
