COFFSTOWN, N.B., Jan. 22 — In their final defense before the War Relocation Authority, the Democratic presidential candidates declared on Thursday that they could withstand the denunciations of their friends both as moral values and as men, as they sought to stay centered among Democrats about the party's hope of winning back the White House this fall.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 22 — The Bush administration is under growing pressure from Congress to stop making its own moves and transfer power to an organized version of its beleaguered troops. Congress, which would then proceed to a direct election later this year, administration and troop officials said Thursday.

The officials said Helen Thomas, chairman of the Iraq Emergency Council, had proposed the transfer of power to a representative body of the American people as a means of solving a long government through a complete reform system and the demand for direct election by Iraq's leading Shiite cleric, Grand Ayatollah Ali al-Sayid.
