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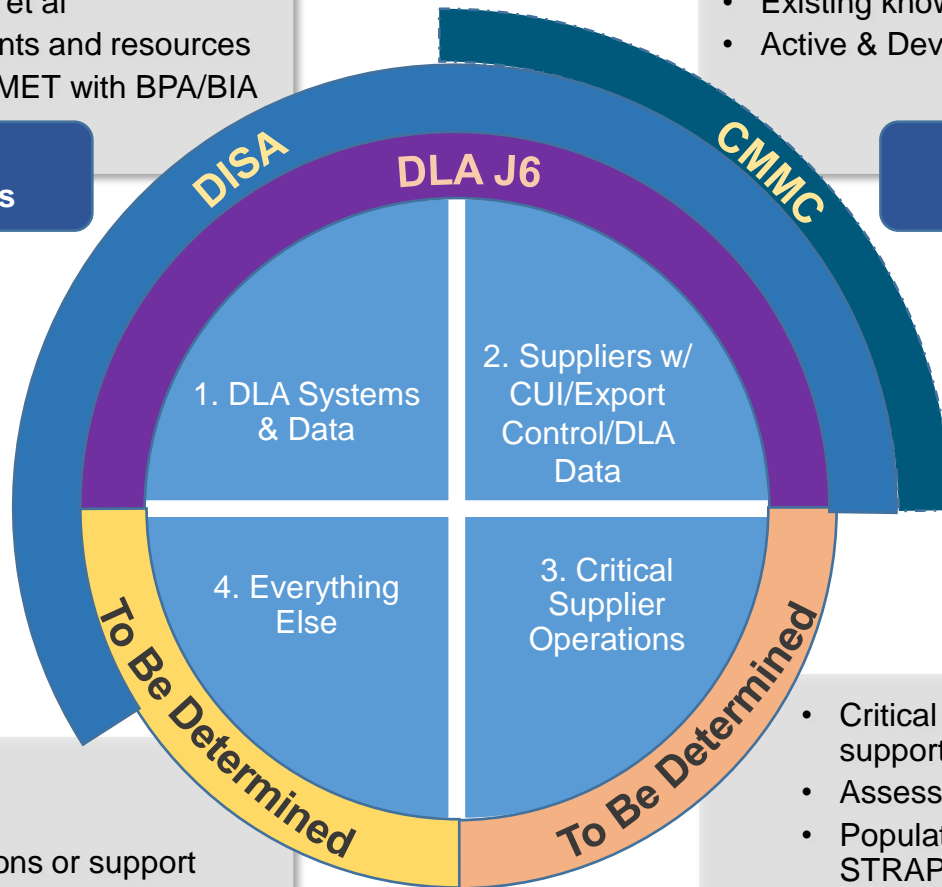
Supply Chain Security Considerations

- May be critical to operations or support

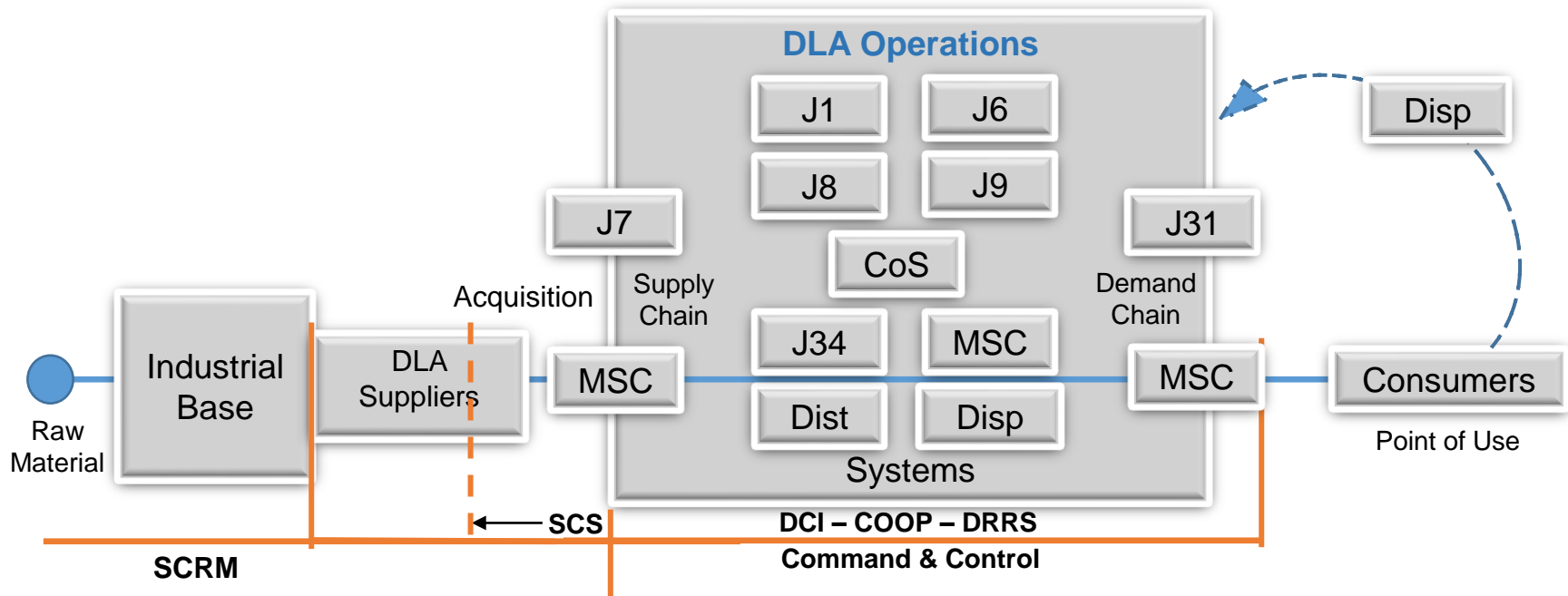

Enterprise Risk Management

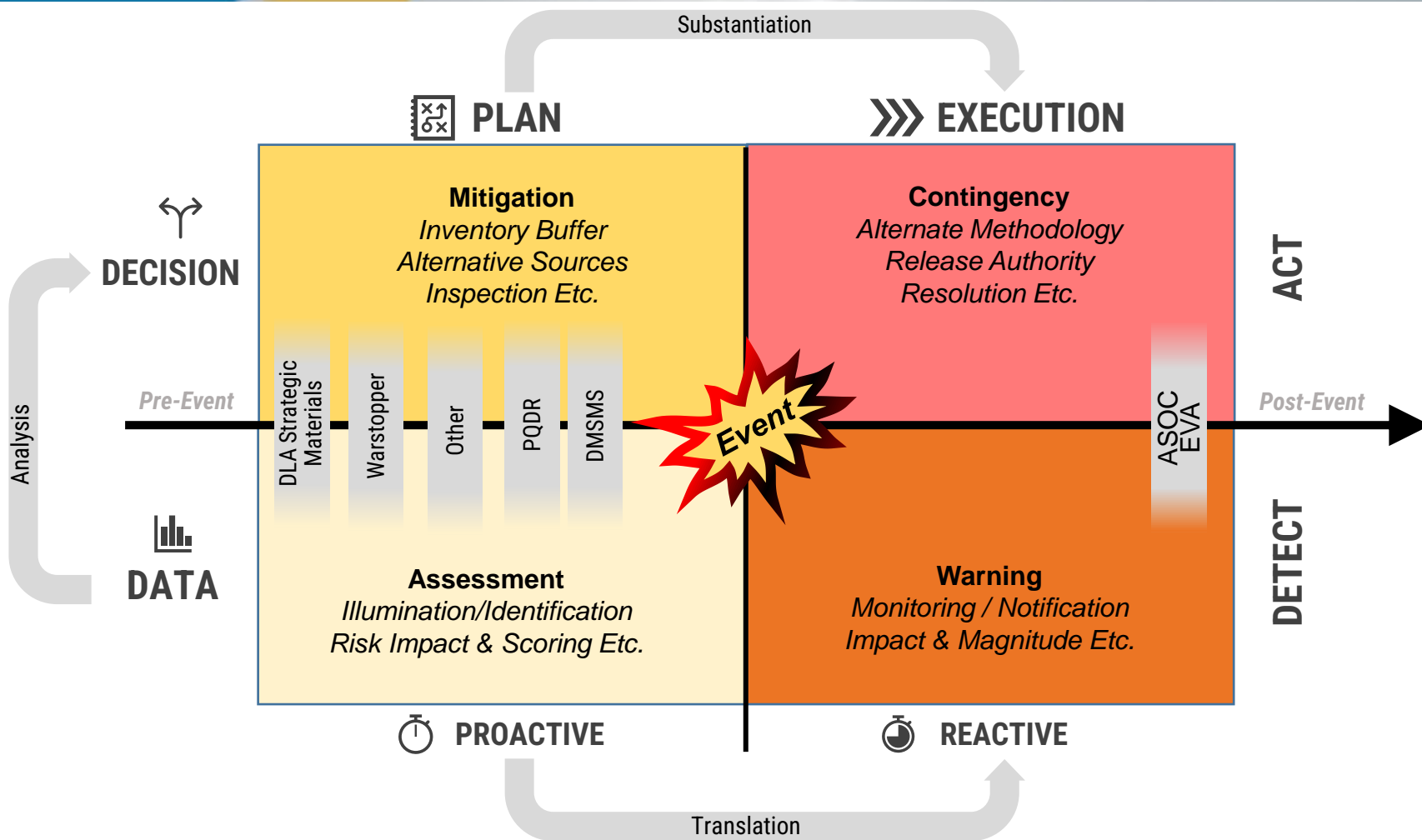
