Key Assumptions

- 1. The post-WWII and post-Cold War world orders are changing; we're entering a new, as of yet undefined, era
- 2. Neither Russia nor China will suffer a major political collapse
- 3. A nation-state's intelligence and security service activities reveal its government's true agenda
- 4. Non-state threat actors have increasing capability and intent

Three Scenarios

- 1. SYSTEMS HOLD
- 2. RIVAL BLOCS
- 3. BATTLE ROYALE



SYSTEMS HOLD

- Despite enormous pressure, the international order (political alliances, commerce, etc.) bends, but doesn't break
- Intensifying competition across all aspects of national power, (DIMEFIL)
- Increasing regulation of economic interaction in key areas of technology with national security impact

RIVAL BLOCS

- Realignment of the world's major economies around two distinct economic blocs
- Near complete strategic decoupling of US/PRC economies
- Intense competition for resources and markets which are not part of either block (i.e., another Cold War, but one that involves economic, not ideological, competition)

BATTLE ROYALE

- Current globalized economic system breaks down, but no new world-wide system arises to replace it
- Economies become extremely regionalized and localized, including transportation, energy, agriculture, manufacturing, and finance
- Widespread geopolitical disruptions: interstate conflict, domestic unrest, and collapse of political systems
