- **The 5 Acquisition Truths:**

- Truth # 1 - People are more important than programs.
- Truth # 2 - Quality is better than quantity.
- Truth # 3 - Competent Acquisition professionals cannot be mass produced.

- Truth # 5 - Acquisition requires enterprise engagement and coordination.

- Take and manage risk

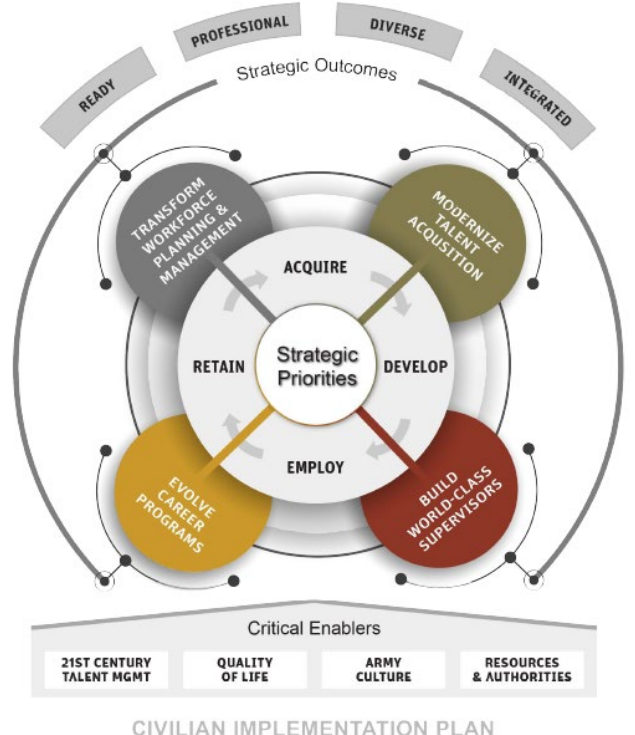

# JPEO Armaments and Ammunition



## Congressional Support Enables JPEO AA to operate at the speed of war:

- Additional funding above the base budget to expand capacity for 155mm Artillery metal parts and LAP, modernize industrial facilities
- Temporary authorizations for Covered Agreements Related to Ukraine
  - Use of VOCCO (Verbal Orders of Commanding Officer) Policy was leveraged for PM CAS program: M795 Metal Parts Second Source
  - Waiver of Limitations Associated with Unfinalized Contract Actions (UCAs);
  - Exemption from Certified Cost & Pricing Requirements

## Army Ammunition Replenishment in support of Readiness:

### Line of Effort #1: GOCO Expansion

- Recent conflict in Ukraine resulted in Supplemental funding
- Army Ammunition Plant Modernization Plan (March 2022) enabled JPEO AA to quickly shift projects to the left
- Army Ammunition Plant Mod Plan Objectives:
  - Increase manufacturing safety and readiness to meet current and future requirements
  - Isolate energetic mass from people
  - Ensure graceful degradation and resilient operations
  - Improve flexibility, maintainability, and sustainability
  - Reduce cost of operations and secure supply chains

### Line of Effort #2: Second Source Expansion

- Focus on awarding contracts to second sources to strengthen the industrial base
- Working to replenish 124M rounds of conventional munitions in support of Ukraine
- Small/Medium/Large Caliber ammunition
- Mortars, Claymore Mines, Mine Clearing Charges

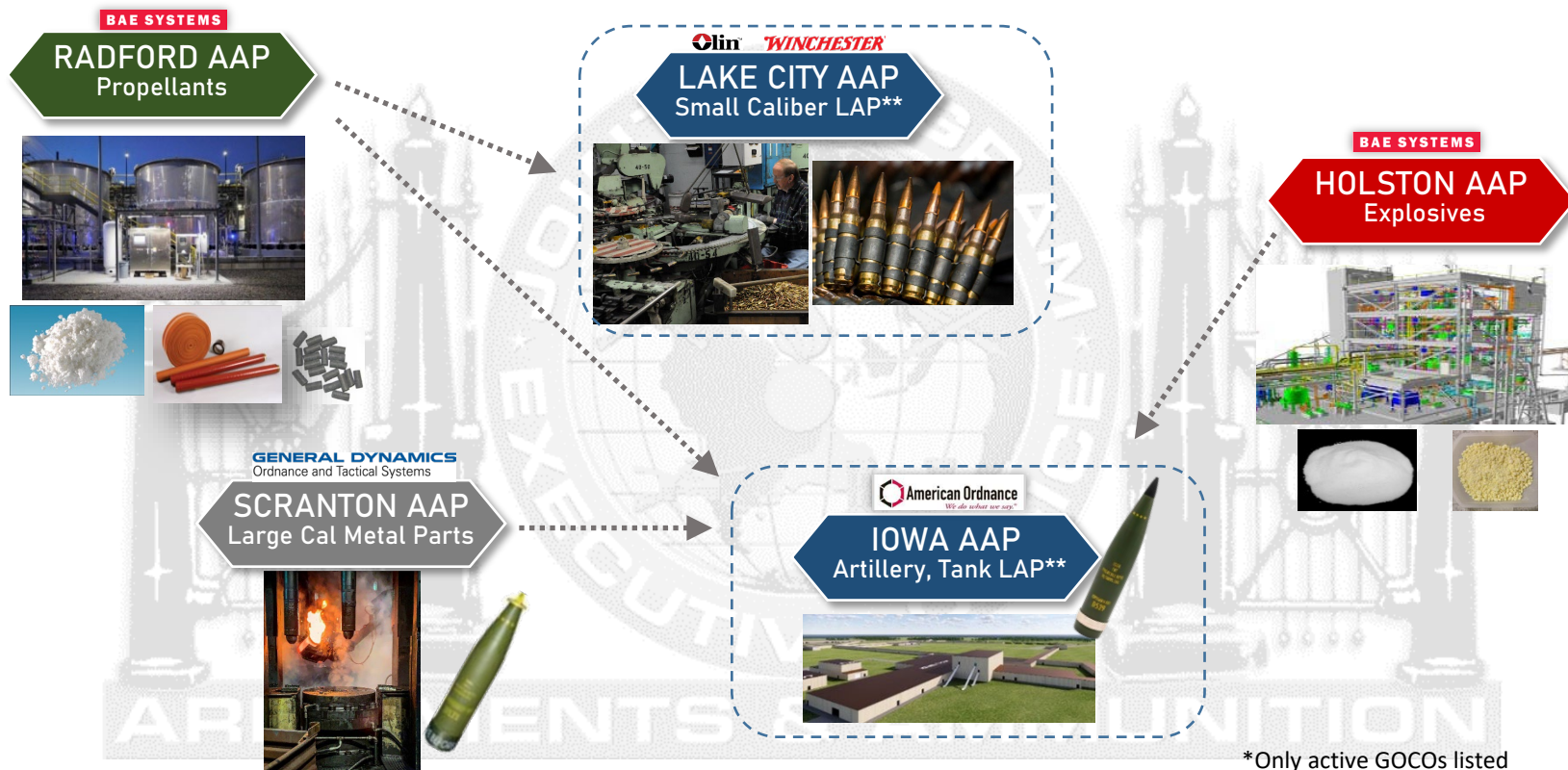
### Line of Effort #3: Foreign Procurement to Mitigate Strategic Risk

- Foreign produced munitions procured for shipment to Poland to support Ukraine efforts to include 155MM HE artillery ammo
  - Additional Munitions include: 122mm rocket, 120mm mortars, 125mm tank ammo, 122mm/152mm HE artillery ammo



# Line of Effort #1: GOCO Expansion

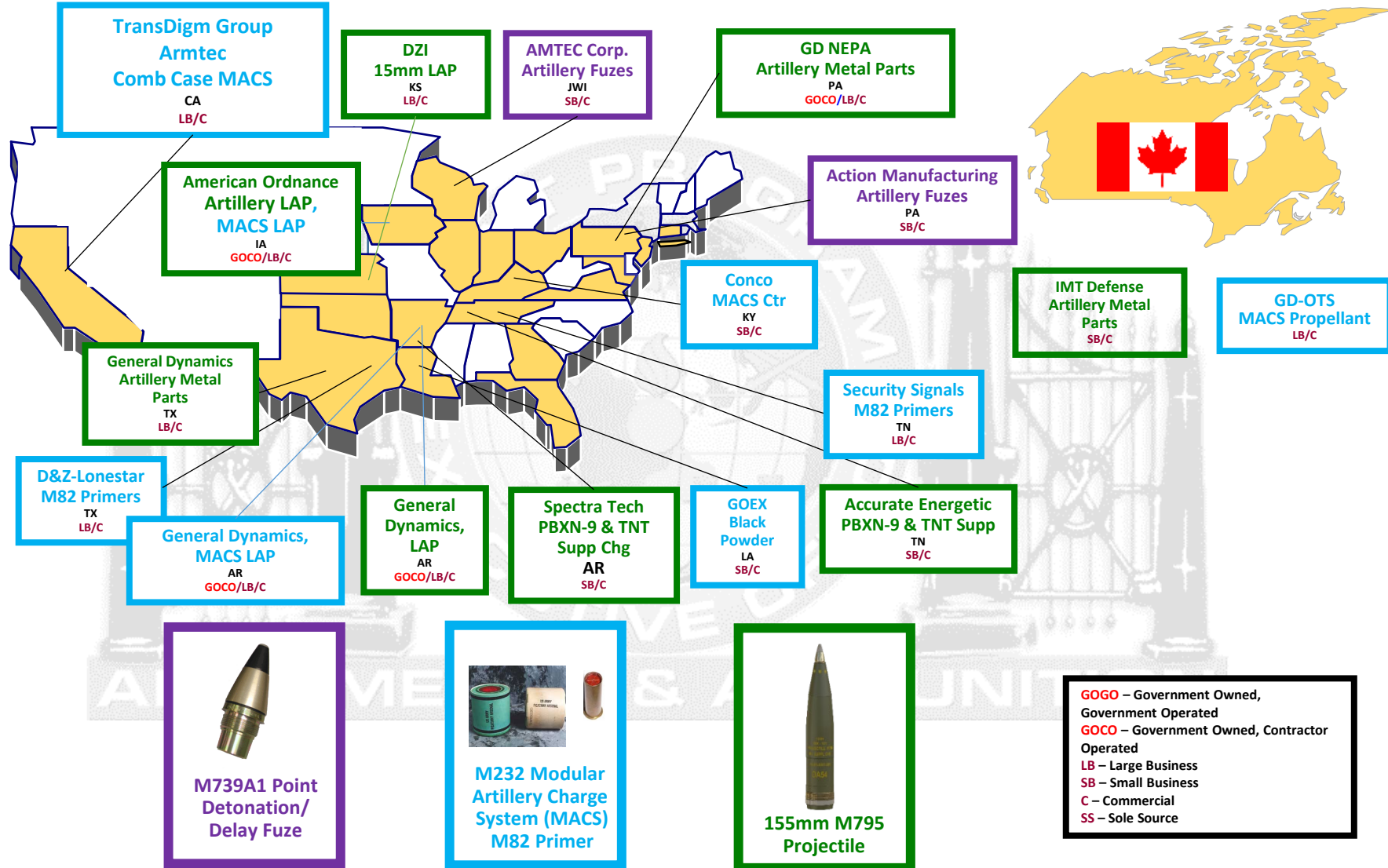
## Government Owned, Contractor Operated (GOCO) Army Ammunition Plants\*
